Eleventh Street Community Garden Application

The gardening season runs from March 1st to the end of February. Returning gardeners must confirm they are returning by February 1st and payment must be received by March 1st. The cost is \$100 per household per year.

Gardeners must contribute work towards the maintenance of the garden.

All adults participating in the garden must sign a Hold Harmless agreement **every year**. Children (under 18 years of age) must have a parent or guardian sign the Hold Harmless agreement.

Hold Harmless Agreement and Release From Liability

- 1. In consideration for property owner, City of Port Angeles, and Eleventh Street Community Garden allowing me (if 18 years of age or older) or my child (if under 18 years of age) to participate in the Eleventh Street Community Garden by coming onto the property owner's premises located at 825 W 11TH ST, Port Angeles, I hereby release, waive, discharge, and covenant not to sue City of Port Angeles and Eleventh Street Community Garden, their officers, agents, servants and employees (referred to as releasees) from any and all liability, claims, demands, actions and causes of action whatsoever arising out of or related to any loss, damage, or injury, including death, that may be sustained by me or my family or any property belonging to same, whether caused by the negligence of releasees, or otherwise, while participating in any activity related to Eleventh Street Community Garden or while otherwise being on the premises.
- 2. I further hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless the above named releasees from any loss, liability, damage or costs, including court costs and attorney's fees, that may incur due to my or my family's participation in Eleventh Street Community Garden or while otherwise being on the premises, whether caused by negligence of the releasees, or otherwise.
- 3. It is my express intent that this Hold Harmless Agreement and Release from Liability shall bind the members of my family and spouse, if I am alive, and my heirs, assigns and personal representative, if not alive, and shall be deemed as a release, waiver, discharge, and covenant not to sue the above named releasees. I hereby further agree that this agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington.

Eleventh Street Community Garden Rules

This is an organic garden. No synthetic chemical pesticides, herbicides, fungicides or fertilizers are allowed. Seeds and plants do not need to be certified organic.

Certain plants are not allowed do to their tendency to spread aggressively and be difficult to remove. Currently prohibited plants are: mint, comfrey, and jerusalem artichokes.

Illegal plants are not allowed. Marijuana may be legal now but you can't grow it in this garden.

Gardeners **must** contribute time to the maintenance of the garden by participating in garden activities like planting, watering, weeding and harvesting, or maintenance of specific garden areas like composting, worm bins, the kids garden, mowing grass and work parties for specific projects.

Smoking, pets and amplified sound are prohibited.

Children must be supervised. Help them learn about gardening and boundaries.

Take your trash home for disposal.

You may garden in any daylight hours of any day.

Work parties may be organized as needed to complete specific tasks.

Proposed rules for the garden in 2015:

At the start of each garden season any interested members will meet to decide what to plant, how much of it to plant and where to plant it.

All members of the garden may harvest any of the crops whenever they wish.

On regularly scheduled work days part of the work will be harvesting anything that is ready. Gardeners may take what they want and the rest goes to the food bank, soup kitchens, etc.

Some crops may be harvested all at once such as garlic, potatoes, winter squash. Those will be divided among the garden members who want them.
